

## **A SAMPLE CONVERSATION FROM DIMENSIONS IN TESTIMONY<sup>SM</sup>**

A highlight of the new Education Center at the Holocaust Memorial Miami Beach is Dimensions in Testimony<sup>SM</sup>, an interactive theater experience developed in collaboration with the USC Shoah Foundation. Presented in two Knight Digital Theaters, Dimensions in Testimony<sup>SM</sup> uses cutting-edge technology to enable visitors to engage in real-time, simulated conversations with Holocaust survivors — even those no longer living — ensuring their stories will endure for generations to come.

The following is an example of a dialogue with Max Eisen, a Holocaust survivor and educator who has since passed away. The interview below was created using his digitally enhanced testimony.

**Q: Max, when did you come to the United States?**

A: I actually immigrated to Toronto after the war.

**Q: Have you been in a concentration camp?**

A: (quietly) I was imprisoned in Auschwitz Two, Auschwitz One and Melk. I was liberated in 1945.

**Q: Have you seen anyone die?**

A: Well, the first experience was in the shower. When we arrived, we were selected and processed, and then in the shower, a young man from my town who had very thick glasses dropped them. He was down on his hands and knees trying to find his glasses. An SS man came in, kicked him, threw him over and stomped on his chest. I remember hearing the cracks of his ribs. He died right on the spot. This was the first victim that I saw. I was in total shock.
